Take a break and enjoy a scoop of gelato; free between 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

*Children Are Citizens* is a collaboration among DC educators, Imagination Stage, National Building Museum, National Gallery of Art, Professional Development Collaborative at the Washington International School, and Project Zero at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. During the 2016–2017 school year, 330 children and 17 educators from across the city explored the idea of young children as citizens in the here and now, with the capacity to contribute to their communities in powerful ways. One result of this effort is the book we are showcasing today, *Washington, DC: "What People Like Most Is in This Book!"* coauthored by DC's youngest citizens.

Los Niños *Son* Ciudadanos es una colaboración entre educadores del Distrito de Columbia, Imagination Stage, National Building Museum, National Gallery of Art, Professional Development Collaborative en Washington International School y Project Zero en Harvard Graduate School.
